

Each family is responsible for their own tent & camping gear. Each family will also be responsible for their own meals. There are usually fire rings unless otherwise noted, so bring some wood if you can and we will have a campfire at night. If you would like to roast hot dogs or marshmallows, be sure to bring skewers along with the hot dogs & marshmallows.

Items you may want bring:

- Clothes
- Comfortable shoes and hiking boots in case the family may want to go hiking.
- Food
- Eating and cooking utensils
- Tent
- A day pack
- Personal items- soap and shampoo, towel, wash cloth, toothbrush and toothpaste, a comb and brush, sun screen, lip balm
- Portable chair
- Sleeping bag
- Extra blankets
- Water supply and water bottles
- Whistle (to be used **only** in an emergency)
- Hats, gloves, warm jacket, long underwear, thick socks (for cooler weather camping)
- Wet weather clothes-water repellent jacket, poncho, and water proof boots
- Pillow
- Flashlights with new (and extra) batteries
- Insect repellent
- Personal first aid kit
- Any medications needed (only parents can dispense medications to their children)
- Lantern w/ fuel
- Camping stove w/ fuel
- Camera
- Spending money
- ... and whatever else you can think of to make your camping experience more enjoyable (As cub scouts, we don't want to really rough it yet)
